Dual EM/ICM consultant wanted to join writing group to develop collaborative working framework between EM/ICM (honorary)

Role description:

The Royal College of Emergency Medicine (RCEM) and the Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine (FICM) are developing a national framework to outline best practice collaborative working between emergency medicine and intensive care medicine. We are looking for an enthusiastic dual or joint EM/ICM consultant to be an active participant in a small virtual writing group developing this framework. The writing group is made up of EM and ICM clinicians, guided by a steering group which includes the RCEM and FICM Presidents. We do not expect a need for face-to-face meetings as collaboration between the writing group members will be by email and teleconference, to reduce time and travel burden for authors.
