The new arrangement will see RCEMLearning produce a monthly podcast devoted to reviewing and discussing new and historic EMJ content. The open access podcast will be an invaluable benefit for RCEM members, it will help keep your colleagues keep up to date with the latest evidence, and it will provide a regular educational resource for the wider EM community.

We are looking for at least two people to join our team to help contribute to the

podcast. Induction and training into house style will be provided, and you will not be required to conduct any technical editing for each edition. It's envisaged the role will require at least 10 hours work on a monthly basis to produce each edition (this will include reading the EM, conducting background research, storyboarding the podcast, recording and administrative time etc.). It is envisaged each edition will be at least 30 minutes long. The podcast will be hosted on RCEMLearning but it won't be part of the existing monthly podcast as it will be released as a separate resource in the middle of each month. This is a new collaboration with plenty of scope to develop and refine.

The majority of work will be conducted remotely but expenses will be covered when attendance is required at RCEMLearning editorial meetings or RCEM events.

- Are ST5 or above (but feel free to convince in an application if you're not ST5 or above!)
- Are a member in good standing with the RCEM
- Be an advocate of FOAMed
- Be willing to develop or improve podcasting skills
